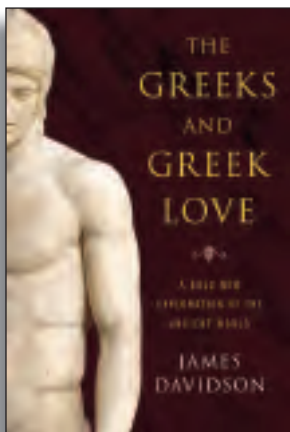
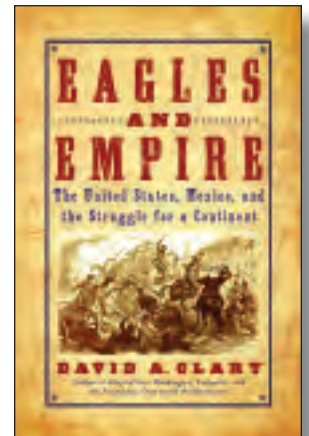
## **Eagles and Empire:** **The United States, Mexico, and the Struggle for a Continent**

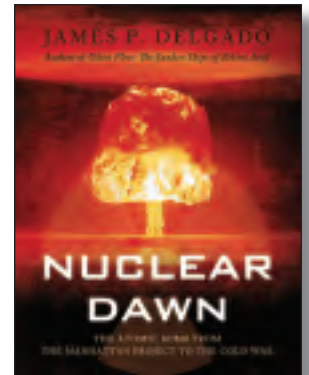
## Nuclear Dawn:
