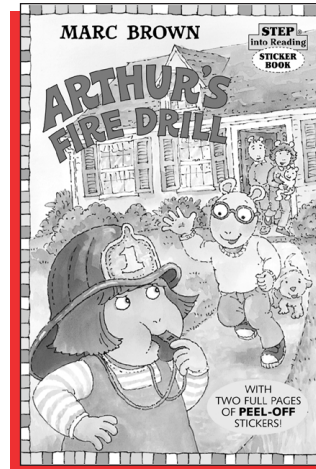


Fire Safety Tips

1. Be sure to install at least one smoke alarm on every floor of your home—and make sure everyone knows the alarm's sound and what to do if they hear it. Smoke alarms should be tested monthly.
2. If you see smoke while you're escaping, try another way out. If you can't avoid the smoke, crawl on your hands and knees with your head 1 to 2 feet above the floor. The air will be cleanest, coolest, and safest there.
3. Don't stop! When you hear a smoke alarm, leave the building immediately. Don't try to save anything. Go to your meeting place so the adults know that you're safe. Never go back into a burning building. Call the fire department from a neighbor's phone, a portable phone, or an alarm box.
4. Hold a home fire drill at least twice a year.
