Most of my jobs have involved writing, but I never considered writing children's books until I read Arnold Lobel's *Ming Lo Moves a Mountain*. I loved the characters, the clever way the story problem is solved, and the way the words and pictures enriched one another. When I turned the last page, a switch went off inside me. I wanted to learn how to write stories that would touch others the way this book had touched me.

Kirby Larson is the author of the 2007 Newbery Honor Book, and New York Times bestseller Hattie Big Sky, which was inspired by her great-grandmother who homesteaded by herself in eastern Montana as a young woman. Kirby has also written three books for younger children.


