Eligibility

- 1. The contest is open to U.S. and Canadian writers who have not previously published a young adult novel. Employees of Random House, Inc. and its subsidiaries and affiliates, and members of their families and households are not eligible.
- 2. Foreign-language manuscripts and translations are not eligible.
- 3. Manuscripts submitted to a previous Delacorte Press contest are not eligible.

Format for Submissions

- Submissions should consist of a book-length manuscript with a contemporary setting that will be suitable for readers ages 12 to 18.
- Manuscripts should be no shorter than 100 typewritten pages and no longer than 224 typewritten pages. Include a brief plot summary with your covering letter.
- 3. Each manuscript should have a cover page listing the title of the novel; the author's name, address, and telephone number. The title should also appear on each manuscript page.
- 4. Manuscripts should be typed double-spaced on 8½" x 11" good quality white paper, and pages should be numbered consecutively. The type should be at least 10 point. The author should retain a copy of any manuscript submitted.
- 5. Photocopies are acceptable if readily legible and printed on good quality white (not gray) paper. Partial or illegible entries will not be accepted.
- 6. Do not submit manuscripts in boxes. A padded envelope will do. The publisher is not responsible for late, lost, misdelivered, or misplaced submissions.

7. Please enclose a business-size stamped, self-addressed envelope for **notification** only. Please do not enclose checks for postage. Due to new postal regulations, the publisher **cannot** return any manuscripts. All submissions will be recycled by Random House after they are read.

Multiple Submissions

- 1. Manuscripts sent to Delacorte Press may not be submitted to other publishers or literary agents while under consideration for the prize.
- Authors may not submit more than two manuscripts to the Delacorte Press competition; each must meet all eligibility requirements.

Dates for Submission

- 1. Manuscripts must be postmarked after October 1, 2008, but no later than December 31, 2008.

- 1. Entries will be judged by the editors of Delacorte Press Books for Young Readers. The prize will be awarded on the basis of originality, style, and creativity.
- 2. The judges reserve the right not to award a prize.
- 3. The decision of the judges will be final.
- 4. The editors of Delacorte Press Books for Young Readers will not be able to offer critiques of manuscripts or enter into correspondence about the manuscripts other than with the winning author.
- 5. Writers will be notified between January and April as submissions are evaluated by the editors. Final contest results will be announced on our Web site on or around April 30, 2009.
