

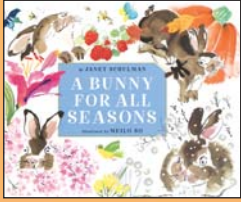

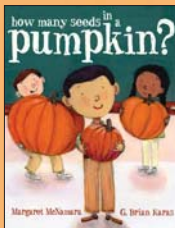

ACTIVITIES / CRAFTS

muffin cup flowers

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

Construction paper : glitter : glue : safety scissors :
crayons : colored pencils : pipe cleaners

- 1 Give each listener a paper muffin cup to glue on construction paper to make spring flowers.
- 2 Kids can color the muffin cups, add stems, make a vase, etc.



stuffed fall pumpkins

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

Orange construction paper : glue : cotton balls or newspaper

- 1 Prepare pumpkin-sized circle cutouts of orange construction paper for each child. Two circles of paper should be stapled together 3 quarters of the way around, leaving an opening at the top.
- 2 Kids can draw jack-o'-lantern faces on their pumpkins, or their favorite fall pictures.
- 3 After they finish drawing, they can stuff cotton balls or newspaper to fill out the pumpkin shape. Help each child staple the top of the pumpkins closed.



cotton ball snowman

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

Construction paper : glue : cotton balls : pipe cleaners :
glitter : googlie eyes

- 1 Glue the cotton balls down on the construction paper in the shape of a snowman.
- 2 Decorate with googlie eyes, pipe cleaners, and other construction paper shapes like coal eyes and carrot noses.



Reproduce the sheet on the opposite page, and ask your listeners to draw their favorite parts of each of the four seasons. Give them suggestions like favorite things to eat, favorite games to play, or favorite holidays.
