- Before the party, make copies of these suggested activities and gather crayons, markers, string, scissors, and tape. Princess Babies have perfect manners, but sometimes they need their grown-up subjects to help!


### Here are some sample questions:

    - Is there a special nickname that you'd like to be called?

Twirl around










### Color Me Princess Baby!

















