

From the internationally best-selling, Pulitzer-Prize-winning author comes a superbly crafted new work of fiction. These eight stories—longer and more emotionally complex than any Lahiri has yet written—take us from Cambridge and Seattle to India and Thailand as they explore the secrets of family life. In the title story, Ruma, a young mother in a new city, is visited by her father, who carefully tends the earth of her garden, where he and his grandson form a special bond. But he's harboring a secret from his daughter, a love affair he's keeping all to himself. And in "Hema and Kaushik," a trio of linked stories, we follow the lives of a girl and boy who, one winter, share a house in Massachusetts. They travel from innocence to experience on separate paths until destiny brings them together again years later in Rome. *Unaccustomed Earth* is rich with Jhumpa Lahiri's signature gifts: exquisite prose, emotional wisdom, and subtle renderings of the most intricate workings of the heart and mind.

**JHUMPA LAHIRI**'s debut story collection, *Interpreter of Maladies*, won the Pulitzer Prize for fiction, as well as the PEN/Hemingway Award, the *New Yorker* Debut of Year, and an American Academy of the Arts and Letters Metcalf Award.
